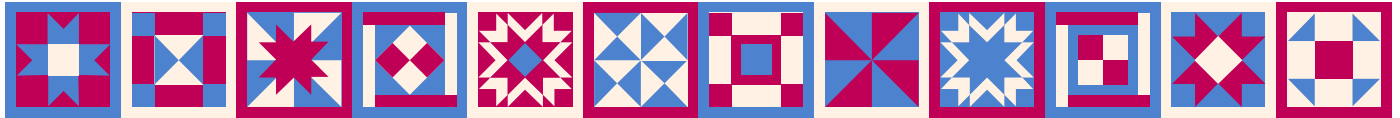

Our potluck dinner is planned for the July meeting. The meeting will begin at 6:30pm.

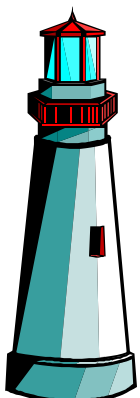
Look at those recipes! Bring something you really like! It would be a good idea if some of you would like to go in on a bigger dish – something meaty? Something veggie-like?

# July Program Notes– It's a Silent Auction!

Here's a chance for you to get rid of those: UFOs, Magazines, Books or even Weird colored fabric you'll never use!! Donate them to the LHQ's Silent Auction!

At the July 25th meeting, we will have donated items on display for the auction. The auction "profits" will benefit our Guild Library, as we need a new storage cabinet (our current one is falling apart!). The auction will take place during our meeting, which includes the Potluck, Business meeting, and Show and Tell.

Here are the guidelines for donating to the Silent Auction:

1. For each item or set of items donated, please:

A. Put in a Ziploc or grocery bag (tied-up)

B. I include an index card or paper with the following information:

1. Your name (please note if you DO NOT want your name noted on the bid sheet, but we'll need your name for reference if the VP of Programming has any questions about the item)

2. Phone Number

3. I identify the item(s), i.e. fabric, pattern, magazines etc.. Please be as SPECIFIC as possible.

4. Approximate value

2. We are taking the following items:

⇒ Books – single books or sets

⇒ Magazines – one year of a title: this could mean 4, 6 or 12 issues of a magazine. Please cut off or cover the address of the subscriber.

⇒ Fabric – all fabrics. If the yardage is noted, that would be a wonderful but not required. Please note if you have a packet of FQs or a kit. Adding any original patterns that may have been included would be a nice touch!

⇒ UFOs – include the pattern (if it has one) or note the block pattern etc on the item's notecard.

⇒ Patterns – originals only – we don't want to violate any copyright infringement!

⇒ Notions/Gadgets – if good shape and with directions if necessary

⇒ Kits – Please include all items or note what items are missing

3. Several items to note:

- Please donate items that another person would want. Be as considerate as possible to your fellow quilters.
- Feel free to donate non-quilting items: knitting, crosstitching, beading, crocheting etc. The same guidelines apply.
- Any items that are not purchased at the auction will be free to the guild members at upcoming meetings.

4. There will be boxes at the next guild meeting to accept items. If you cannot make the next meeting, please call Autumn Latimore 880-4195 and she'll make arrangements to pick up or for you to drop off your items.

5. All donations MUST be in by: Monday, July 18th

Entry form deadline is September 1 to Mary Piper or Christy Schliesman.

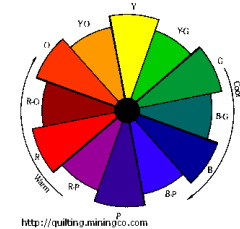
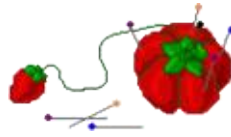
Each entry must be in a pillowcase or cloth bag with name and class number indicated.

## June Program: Judy Zoelzer Levine

### QUILTING ROOM SOLUTIONS

A look at how quilters have solved workspace, storage, and organizational problems. This lecture covers from neatnik to slob and is a must for anyone who– when ready to work– hates spending most of her time looking for her scissors!

Who is Judy Zoelzer Levine?

Judy has been making quilts since 1983. Throughout her career her quilts have been distinguished by unusual fabrics from her early wool quilts to her more recent use of non-traditional materials including straight pins and barbed wire. Judy takes an intuitive approach to her work letting the fabrics and textures guide the design.

Judy's many quilting activities have included curating quilt exhibits for the Wisconsin Quilt History Project, Cedarburg, WI., Katie Gingrass Gallery, Milwaukee, WI and teaching quilting to seventh and eighth graders as part of the art curriculum at a Milwaukee private school.

Her quilts have been displayed in invitational and juried art and quilt shows including Quilt National '93, Fantastic Fibers, and Materials Hard and Soft and have traveled to Japan, New Zealand, and the Republic of Georgia. Her work has been published in books and magazines and are included in several corporate and private collections.

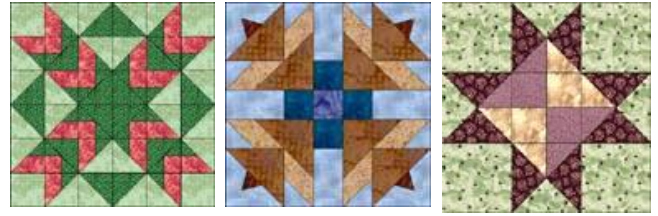
These quilt camps are open to anyone who wants/needs to escape from "real" life for a short time. Be warned, however, that re-entry is tough!!!
